Arkansas GOP Hires Political Communications Director, Deputy Political Communications Director to Help Lead Party Through 2022 Election Cycle

LITTLE ROCK, AR – The Republican Party of Arkansas (RPA) today announced it hired Tyler Jordon to serve as the Political Communications Director and Julie Williams as the Deputy Political Communications Director for the Party. Jordon and Williams will oversee communications, grassroots, messaging, and mobilization efforts for the Party in the 2022 election cycle.

Tyler Jordon has worked in communications and politics in the nonprofit, corporate, and political sectors. Previously, Jordon served as an associate at PLUS Communications, the sister agency to Republican political consulting firm FP1 Strategies, and as the communications coordinator for the West Virginia Republican Party in the 2018 election cycle. Jordon has a B.A. in political science from the University of Mississippi and an M.A. in political communication from American University.

Julie Williams, a Southwest Arkansas native, most recently served as a field representative and projects coordinator in the district office of U.S. Congressman Bruce Westerman (AR-04). During her undergraduate career, she worked closely with the Party on local campaigns alongside the Clark County Republican Committee and the Arkansas Federation of College Republicans. Williams has a B.A. in mass communications and political science from Ouachita Baptist University.
